OPIOID SETTLEMENT UPDATES FOR NC LOCAL GOVERNMENTS August 2023

For NC local governments receiving opioid settlement funds, here are some important updates from the NC Department of Justice (NC DOJ):

[1] <u>Confirm and Update</u>: August 18 is the deadline to confirm that you received recent opioid settlement payments and update your local contact info through the Annual Status Survey. Please use this link: https://unc.az1.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV 6Xd33wUdnIzIYjI

[2] Updated MOA Guidance: NC DOJ has released two important documents:

- An updated FAQ about the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA)
- New guidance on the steps that local governments must take to authorize opioid settlement spending under the MOA and state law

[3] <u>Annual Reports Due Soon</u>: September 27 is the deadline for local government receiving opioid settlement funds to file their Annual Financial Reports and Annual Impact Reports.

- Note that the requirements for the Annual Financial Report (MOA Exhibit E) and Annual Impact Report (MOA Exhibit F) were recently modified by the NC MOA Coordination Group.
